Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was fair to good; Offerings were in good balance on 3.5 and smaller sizes; fully adequate on 3.5 and heavier sizes. Live supplies were generally moderate; weights were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 56 to 67 cents. Trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, drums and wings continued to clear well. Boneless skinless breasts were available and difficult to place. Bone-in breasts varied from short to available. Adequate supplies of leg quarters cleared satisfactorily at some plants, slowed at others.
