JUNE 21, 1995 Wheat bids rebounded as export demand improved. Com bids jumped slightly higher due to strong wheat demand and indications that Russia may be back in the market soon for US grain. Soybean bids were slightly lower on scattered Midwest rains reported overnight. Wheat 6 to 10 cents higher except Portland 20 to 24 cents lower. Com 1 to 3 cents higher. Sorghum 2 to 4 cents higher. Soybeans 1 to 5 cents lower except Kansas City 1 to 2 cents higher. Sharp advances in wheat pits were due to overnight purchases from Africa and Egypt. Indications China may also tender soon for US wheat, underpinned bids. Fund buying pushed futures to new highs late in the day. Portland wheat fell lower, however, as nearby export needs this week have been filled. Spillover strength from wheat pushed corn bids upward. Some rain fell in the Corn Belt areas overnight but were scattered and most places remain a dry. This has been a good week for export corn demand. Soybean bids were slightly lower as unexpected rains in southern and central Illinois overnight were reported heavy. However, forecasts now call for less than expected moisture the rest of the week which limited gains. Export demand:


