

### **DOMINION DAY IN CANADA**

**Called** variously Canada Day, Dominion Day, or Confederation Day, July 1 in Canada celebrates the Udate in 1867 when the provinces to our north were united in Dominion The Maritime Provinces were initially reluctant to join, hoping to unite among themselves, but Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island were convinced early on. (Newfoundland held her ground until 1948, then joined.) It took until 1931 before Canada was proclaimed a self-governing Dominion within the British Empire. As recently as 1982, Canada took a final step toward its independence by securing the right to amend its constitution.

### FRESH PEA SOUP

- 4 cups shelled peas (about 4 pounds fresh unshelled, peas)






