BAIR (York Co.) — Angela Mummert has been crowned as the 1995-96 York County Dairy Princess. Her selection was announced during the county's pageant coronation ceremonies, held June 17 at the York 4-H Center.

Angela, 17, is the daughter of Diane and Dennis Mummert, Glen Rock R2. She is a senior at Dallastown Area High School, where she is a member of the band front color guard and the yearbook staff. Her future plans include college, possibly pursuing a degree in elementary education.

Last year, Angela served as York County's alternate dairy princess. She is employed at Bupplynn Farms, Seven Valleys, assisting with milking chores

evenings and weekends.

For her skit, Angela wrote and illustrated an original children's story, "Bessie Moo Goes to the Beach."

When questioned how she would respond to an accusation that milk is not good for people, Angela answered that she would offer to supply materials and information that show the positive health and nutritional benefits of dairy foods.
