**Amy A. Phillips
Named Outstanding
Ag Student**

Amy A. Phillips, daughter of David L. and Robin Phillips, Mohrsville, Pa., was recently named winner of the 1995 DEKALB Agricultural Accomplishment Award. The award, sponsored nationwide by DEKALB Genetics Corporation, is presented to the outstanding senior agricultural student demonstrating superior scholarship, lead-

ership, in a supervised agricultural program. A long time supporter of youth activities, DEKALB has presented Ag Accomplishment awards since 1947. Based in DeKalb, Illinois, DEKALB Genetics Corporation is an international researcher, producer and marketer of corn, sorghum, soybeans, alfalfa, and sunflower seed.

Amy graduated in June from Tulpehocken High School, Bernville, where she served as 1995 President of the Tulpehocken FFA

Chapter. Her agricultural program consists of her registered Jersey cows and heifers and her performance Quarter Horse mare. Following graduation, Amy plans to attend McNeese State University, Lake Charles, Louisiana, and major in nursing along with some ag studies. She was also awarded a scholarship from the university to participate and compete on their intercollegiate Rodeo Team.

As this year's DEKALB winner, Amy received a pin and certificate, and her name will be inscribed on a special plaque displayed in the school's main lobby. The DEKALB Award, often considered the highest honor a vo-ag student can receive on the local level, is presented at nearly 3,000 schools annually.

Amy, listed in the 1995 edition of "Who's Who In American High School Students," was also awarded at her graduation, the S.P. Wilhelm Nursing Scholarship, The Tulpehocken Young Farmers Scholarship, The Berks County Farm Women Group #8 Award, and the Bernville Grange #1887 Award.

She resides with her parents on their dairy farm and boarding stables where she is employed fulltime milking the 50 head of registered Jersey cows.

Also a member of the Central Pennsylvania Youth Rodeo Association, and a current leader in the 14-18 year old age group, Amy competes monthly across Pennsylvania in barrel racing, pole bending, goat tying, and breakaway roping with her Quarter Horse, Candy's Copper Penny. In her efforts as a 4-H Ambassador for Berks County 4-H, Amy has concentrated on promoting good horsemanship, the safety and good animal husbandry practiced at rodeos, and the good fellowship in competing with other youth.

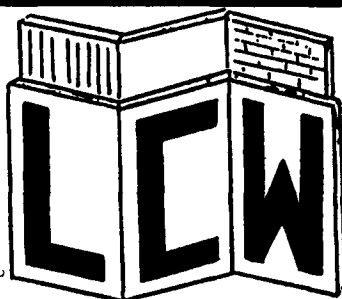

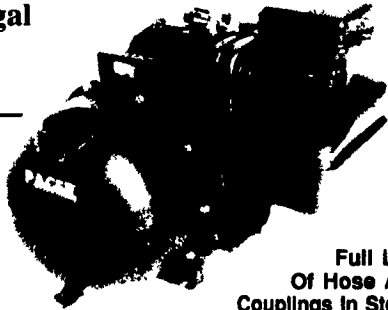

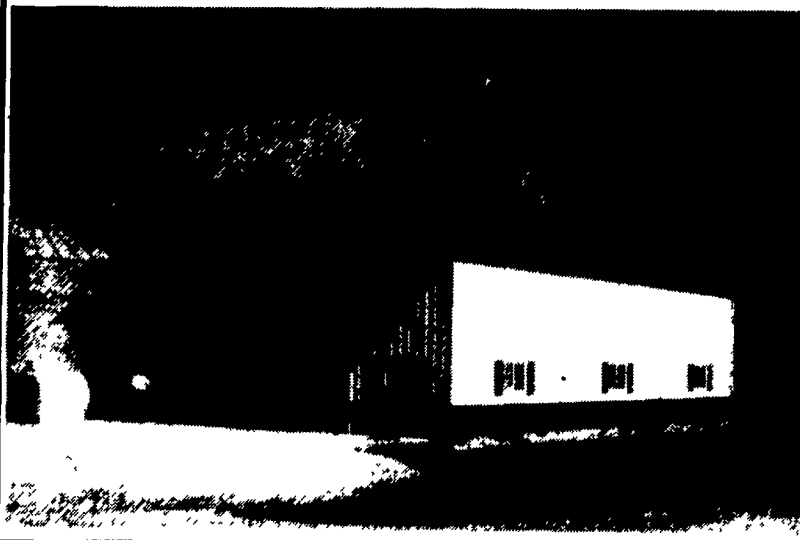
