Grain and soybean bids extended yesterday's gains. Wheat climbed higher on lower world wheat ending stocks forecast and a lower crop production figure for Kansas wheat. Corn and soybean bids soared due to hot, dry weather conditions in the Midwest and lower than expected ending stocks figures. Wheat 1 to 6 cents higher. Corn 2 to 4 cents higher. Sorghum 7 to 15 cents higher. Soybeans 5 to 9 cents higher. Wheat bids moved slightly higher in reaction to USDA's stocks report estimating ending wheat stocks for 1995-96 at their lowest level since 1975-76. Also, Kansas wheat production was estimated at 302.4 million bushels, down from 374.5 million previously released by USDA. Very little export business for wheat this week, limited gains. Advances in corn and bean bids were due to hot, dry weather in the Midwest and remains in forecasts through this weekend. Support also stemmed from reduced corn stocks estimate for 94-95. Lower ending bean stocks also strengthened bids as USDA estimated 325 million bushels, down from the 355 million reported in June. Export demand has remained very slow for corn and beans

this week, despite indications China is seeking US corn.
