

Penn State's Dairy Science Club Is National Champion

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.) — Penn State's Dairy Science Club placed first in outstanding chapter competition at the annual meeting of the Student Affiliate Division of the American Dairy Science Association (ADSA-SAD) held at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York, last month. The club is now five times national champion. Following Penn State in this year's competition were Cal Poly in second and Virginia Tech in third. Chapters are judged on club activities, yearbook design and content, and meeting participation and displays.

The club's yearbook, *The Dairyman*, placed second in yearbook competition. Jayne Hess (Gettysburg) and Carrie Bryant (Honesdale) were co-editors of this year's award winning annual.

Jayne Hess was named outstanding senior of the Student Affiliate Division for her work with the Penn State Dairy Science Club over the past three years and her leadership in ADSA-SAD. Hess was a very active club member, having served as Cheesebox Sale chair, two-time yearbook editor, and chair of Foster Family Farm Day.

She received numerous honors while at Penn State, including

Outstanding Senior Student in the College of Agricultural Sciences. Recently she graduated with highest distinction and is now employed by Mid-Atlantic Milk Marketing Association. She completed her term as ADSA-SAD third vice president at the Cornell meetings.

In this year's undergraduate presentation competition, Marsha Chess (Fredonia), a sophomore majoring in Dairy and Animal Science, placed third in the dairy products division with her paper, *Milk — is it still perfect?*

Matt Espenshade (Elizabethtown), a senior in the Dairy and Animal Science major, competed in the production division. His topic was on The European Animal Rights Movement and Its Effects on U.S. Animal Production.

Dairy and Animal Science junior Carrie Bryant discussed the Penn State Dairy Jubilee in the activities symposium and was elected second vice president of the national association for the coming year. Charles Houpp (sophomore) and Howard Reyburn (senior) also represented the Dairy Science Club at the Cornell meeting.

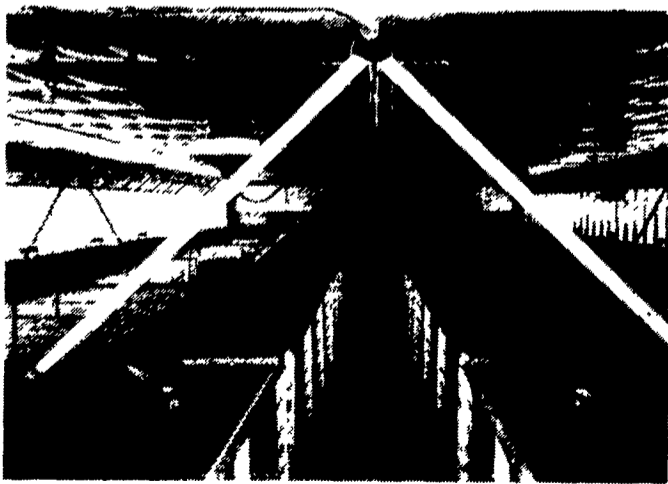

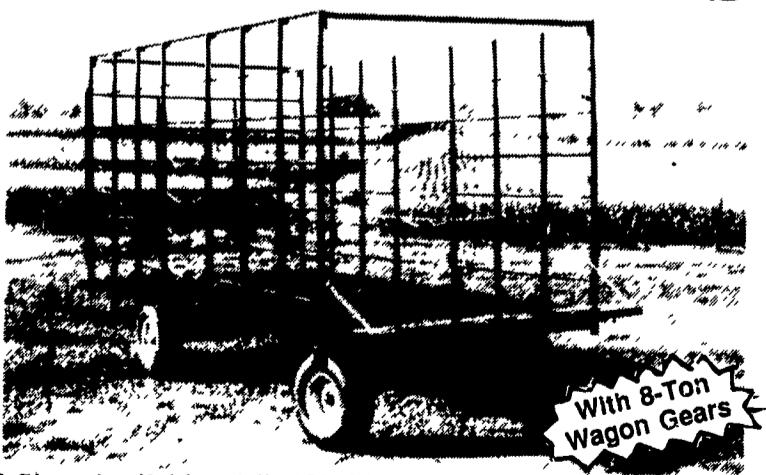
