BEST FISHING DAYS

hen the Moon is between New (July 27) and Full (August 10), fishing is improved, some say. Other best fishing times are when the ocean tides are restless before their turn and in the first hour of ebbing. All fish in all waters — salt or fresh — feed most heavily then. An hour before and an hour after the high tide or the low tide is considered

optimum. Inland, times for high tides would correspond to the times the Moon is due south. Low tides are halfway between the high tides. When we can get off to gb fishing is always a better time than when we can't, although it's not necessarily the best.


