


## One-O-One Farm

Myron and Lori Bonzo with parents Lloyd and Reatha own One-O-One Registered Holstein Farm, located in Beaver County 30 miles north of Pittsburgh. The new Dairy of Distinction is also a Century Farm, and they raise corn and alfalfa to feed the cows on 250 acres of owned and rented ground. They specialize in top quality genetics with a small herd of 35 cows that average 24,000 pounds of milk and classification BAA of 106.7. An EX Mark daughter made over 36,000 pounds of milk last lactation. To be successful, Myron says you need to pay attention to the little things and grow the best hay possible to feed the cows.







## Carper-Homestead Farm

Duane and Linda Biddle and their 10 year-old son Nicholas represent the sixth and seventh generations to live and farm the Carper-Homestead Farm, located south of Roaring Spring. Corn, alfalfa, and oats are grown on their 100 acres to feed their 55 Holstein milk cows and additional young stock. They just built a new freestall barn in April and feed a TMR mix. Herd average is 19,600. Duane said to be a successful farmer, you need to trust in the Lord, work at it, and don't take on too much at one time.
