Danshire Farm is one of the new Potter County Dairy of Distinction Farms. Daniel and Shirley Tice moved from Dauphin County to this farm back in 1969. They and their family milk 55 registered Holstein and Ayrshire cows and have additional replacements. The herd average is 19,700. They house the cows in a tie-stall barn and milk with a pipeline. They work 200 acres of ground and raise corn, alfalfa, and barley. And the family is dedicated to farming. Other family members include son Leon and his wife Kathy, and their children Brandt, 7, and Nina, 4. Daughter Tina, and her husband Jim Currier, and their children Lydia, 7, and Julie, 3. And son Dan, Jr., who is 15.



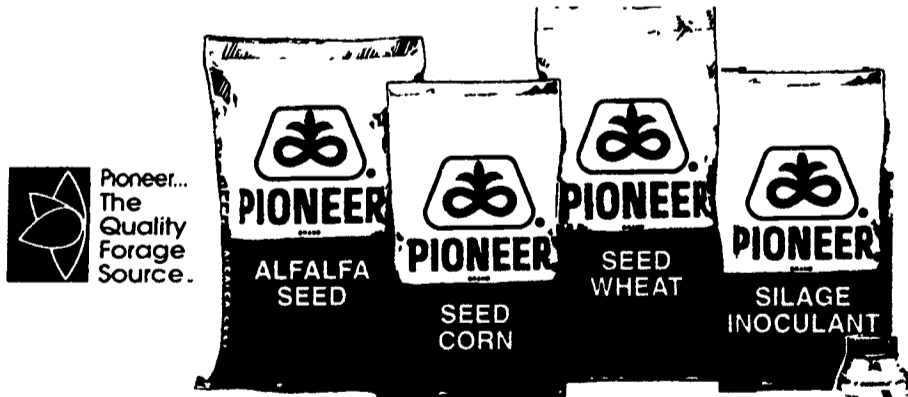
Rocky Hollow Farms

Rocky Hollow Farms in Somerset is a family farm being operated by the father-son partnership of Eldon and Mark Sechler, fourth and fifth generation family on the farm, respectively. The handsome farmstead sits along Rt. 281, a main Somerset thoroughfare. The partnership formed in 1981 and the two own 800 acres and rent additional ground to raise a total of about 150 acres alfalfa hay, 175 acres of corn, and about 75 acres of barley to feed their 115-head, closed milking string of registered and grade Holsteins. The herd is on official DHIA test and has a rolling herd average of about 19,500 pounds of milk. The operation consists of an old bank barn with a freestall extension, and a new brick milkhouse, a Virginia-style heifer barn and two small poultry buildings converted to raise calves. They milk in tie stalls.
