Export demand for wheat has slowed somewhat over the past couple of days and indications Egypt may not buy more US wheat for a while, added extra pressure. Cooler weather and rainfall in Midwest forecasts for next week, pushed corn and soybean bids slightly lower. Some strength in beans was noted, however, on reports China may be interested in buying US
