

Royal Haven Takes Champion Holstein Honors At Annual Troy Fair

TROY (Bradford Co.) — Excitement mounted as four champions — Jersey, Holstein, Brown Swiss, and Ayrshire — paraded around the show ring at the 120th Troy Fair.

Slowly, Chris Hill of Maryland examined each individual before moving to the one he selected as supreme. With a slap on the rump, Nobledale Juno Vermont, a junior 3-year-old Jersey owned by Nobledale Farm, took the top position.

Other animals in contention for supreme champion were Lynn and Bonnie Miller's grand champion Holstein, junior 3-year-old Royal Haven Inspire Quill; the grand champion Ayrshire, 5-year-old Shale Hill Champs Trina, owned by Mark Carter; and the grand champion Brown Swiss, Elm Brook Blend Tyra, a senior 2-year-old owned by John Yurkanin Jr.

The selection of the supreme champion immediately followed the Holstein show which took

place on Saturday, July 29.

Taking the reserve grand champion Holstein position was Braund Valley Laban Lisa, a senior 3-year-old owned by Greta Braund.

Among the junior animals, a fall yearling, David Packard's Pack Herd Encore Bazoka, captured the junior champion position while a fall calf, Mt Glen Broker Lucy, owned by Ben and Regina Jackson, took the reserve junior champion spot.

In a close race for exhibitor and breeder points, the Packard family captured both the premier breeder and premier exhibitor banners at the conclusion of the show.
