## Collaborative Research

NEWARK, Del. — The College of Agricultural Sciences at the University of Delaware has merged two departments, the department of animal science and agricultural biochemistry and the department of food science, to create the department of animal and food sciences, effective July 1.

The merger, approved by the UD faculty senate and board of trustees, will bring all the departments in the college under one roof. Food science faculty, formerly housed in Alison Hall, will be moving to Townsend Hall over

the next month into renovated office and laboratory space.

"The merger enhances the synergy among scientists in the two programs," said Dr. John Nye, dean of the college. "Food scientists now will be able to focus on research addressing critical food safety issues of importance to producers and the public."

Dr. John K. Rosenberger, a microbiologist and chair of the former department of animal science and agricultural biochemistry, will chair the new department.

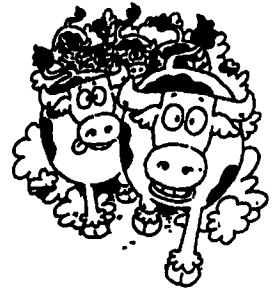
