Wheat bids continued on the downward path due to lack of new export business and profit taking on the board. Corn and soybean bids were mixed with slight strength stemming from good export sales this week and some crop concerns. Recent favorable growing conditions in the Corn Belt limited gains. Wheat 2 to 14 cents lower. Corn mixed. Sorghum 1 to 5 cents lower. Soybeans mixed. Wheat bids remained weak from good crop conditions and beneficial rains in spring wheat growing areas. Additional pressure was due to continued slow wheat export sales business this week. Export demand has been good for corn and beans this week. Corn and bean crops are looking good but aren't out of the woods yet. Ideas that lower than expected yields could occur in some areas of the Midwest if cool temperatures set in too soon. However, right now, crops are loving the wet, cool conditions.
