SHIPPENSBURG (Cumberland Co.)—The Le-Ida Farm of Newville turned out to be a big winner during the Holstein Show at the Shippensburg Fair.

Le-Ida achieved that status by taking both the premier breeders award and the premier exhibition award for the show.

There were several multiple winners during the show, however.

Jeffrey Reasner of Shippensburg captured the senior and grand champion open titles with his 5-year-old, C Warrenton CC Michelle. He also won the best udder class with that animal.

Elizabeth L. Walton of Carlisle took the 4-H senior and grand champion awards with her 4-year-old, Fountain Farm Lead Molly. That same cow also earned Walton the best animal bred and owned by an exhibitor award and was picked as the reserve grand champion in the open competition.

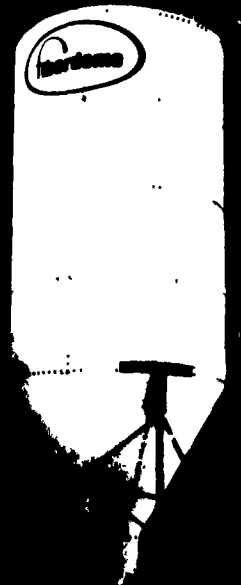
