thinking that someone had come into the barn and intentionally had put drugs in the milk."

After talking to many industry people, Moser said he couldn't get any good clues as to what was happening.

"After some persistent calling to Atlantic Dairy Co-op, Dairylea and others, I was told about new testing standards that went into effect in January, 1995.

"All of a sudden, I have learned about beta-lactams and a host of other names that I cannot spell, nor

pronounce."

He said he then found out about the new tests and how it and the industry confirmation tests (which are not the confirmation tests that Cullor suggested) were giving positive results for beta-lactams.

"By the end of the first quarter, we had a total of 35 claims for contaminated milk. You can readily see a quick problem for the insurance companies when we would expect possibly 10 during the entire year and we now had 35 claims on hand for the first three months."

He said that he contacted Jim Dell at PDA and other insurance

Cullor said he hopes something can be done soon to fix the problem.

"I'm basically hopeful that everyone will take a look now and recognize that we have a problem and try to address it."

companies writing the same types of policies and found the other insurance companies were experience the same types of leaps in claims from presumably contaminated milk.

According to Moser, Dell called him back after checking with surrounding states and that they were experience about a 100-percent increase in milk dumpings.

In his presentation, Moser said the only thing different that he could determine was the change in testing.

However, he said that being considered is the theoretical possibility that some drug residues actually stayed in the cow's system longer than the withdrawal period on the label.

On the other hand, in Dell's report, he said that the January effective date of federal rules changing testing has resulted in a significant increase in milk being dumped.

"During the first quarter of 1995, three million pounds of milk were confirmed positive for drug residues and dumped. This was a loss of 103 tanker loads of milk, or \$335,000!"

Neither Dell, nor Moser promoted the concept that the confirmatory tests being used are causing the problem.

However, Cullor said that he doesn't blame regulatory people for not rejecting the new tests.

Just as an officer of the law is supposed to "go by the book," even if the law is wrong, regulatory people are supposed to carry out the programs, not check the validity of the testing programs the rulemakers give them.

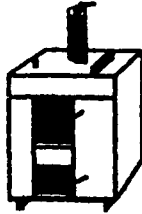

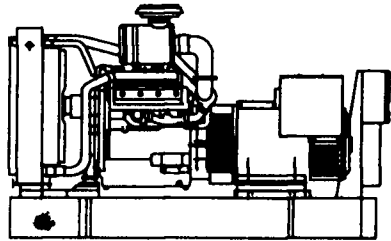

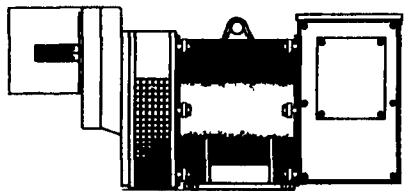
