Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was about moderate and typical of mid-week activity. Seller offerings were fully sufficient for immediate needs; weights remained irregular in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 61 to 72 cents. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady. In the parts complex, supplies were adequate for immediate shipment, but were rapidly tightening on breast items and leg quarters for later deliveries. Wings were fully adequate in most quarters.

Prices were higher for mediums, unchanged on the balance. The market tone was steady to fully steady. Demand was fair to good, best where featured.

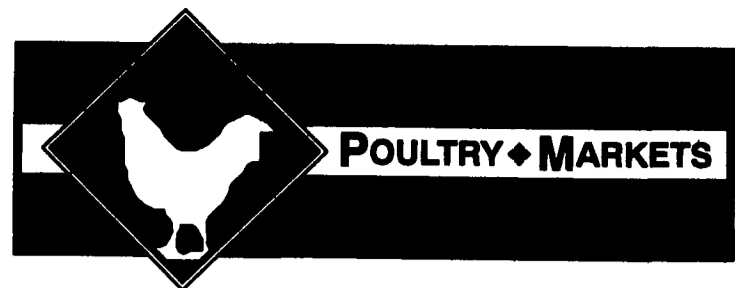

The market tone was steady to instances firm, mostly steady to fully steady. Demand covered the full range and was mostly moderate; best movement was into retail and fast food features. Supplies were generally adequate for the large sizes, and mediums were closely balanced to adequate; extra eggs were usually available when sought, and current wholesale trading prices were mostly steady. Breaking stock supplies were adequate for the mostly moderate demand, and prices were unchanged. Spent hen offerings remained adequate.

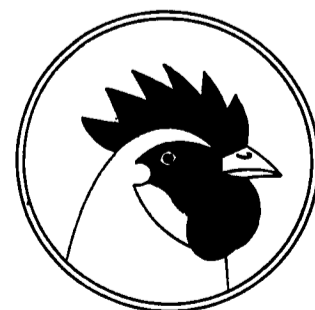
