Fifteen breeds of sheep will be shown and exhibited. These include both wool and market breeds. Approximately 200 sheep will be on display.

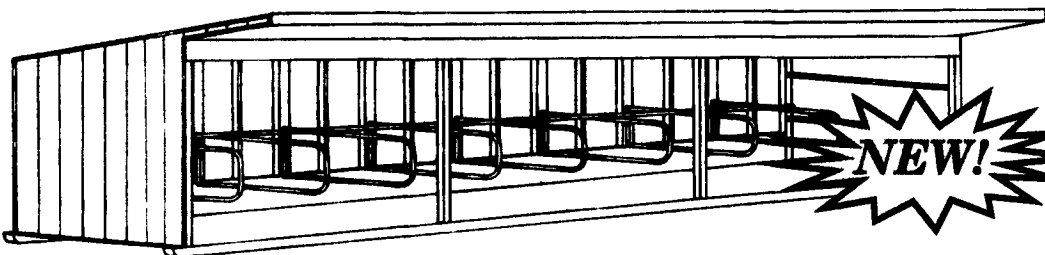
