The daughter of Mark and Martha Miller and a master showman, Kirsten, in 1993, also had the show's supreme champion.

Ben Miller, her brother, was a pretty strong competitor with Milbro-Lindys Illusion, the Holstein reserve grand champion. Last year his was the supreme champion, so the siblings have been seesawing over the title.

They are members of the Stitch and Squirt 4-H Club and credit good genetics and nutrition for the consistent quality of their dairy animals. And they help each other.

Matthew Moyer's 5-year-old, Saints Silver Candy, was the grand champion in the Jersey breed. Reserve grand champion was Maranatha Marty Iris, owned by Ezra VanTassel.

The program will include tour of the farm, nutrient management regulation updates, a discussion of manure handling options, and demonstration of an irrigator for wastewater recycling. Contributing to the discussion will be other farmers, representatives from Franklin County Crop Management Association, Atlantic Dairy Cooperative, Natural Resource Conservation Service, Conservation District, Cooperative Extension and Department of Environmental Protection. Cam Tabb operates a 600-cow dairy in West Virginia and is a certified compost operator. He will be on hand to discuss composting operations suitable for dairies.
