Along with the old comes something new - Laser Runner. Laser Runner is a laser tag game where each person is suited in a thick vest with sensors on the front and back to provide the costume. A phaser-like pistol linked by cable to the vests power pack completes the ensemble. Players dive
into the cruiser which is divided into several chambers connected by portals. Rubbery pillars of varying height provide cover. Points are scored with each hit you make.
