Prices were slightly lower for yolks and blends, and the balance of prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady. Demand was light for immediate needs, and was expected to improve after the Labor Day holiday. Floor stocks of frozen products were adequate. Shell egg supplies were adequate and prices were steady. Liquid and frozen eggs processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending August 26, 1995 were 1% less than last week, and 5% greater than the same week last year.

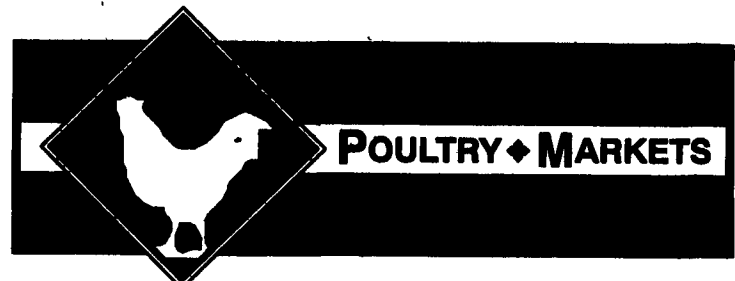
