They look at the horse with an eye for its gentleness, "unflappability," and the ease with which it is handled. Often, a horse which has been a children's pet, is well socialized and generally makes a good therapeutic riding horse. She would like to see the distinction "TRH" — therapeutic riding horse placed after the names of these horses. This would easily indicate to therapeutic riding groups that a particular horse has had much specialized training.

The participants in "Best of Friends" are preparing for a horse show to be held at Rose Hill Stables on August 20. This will give

the riders an opportunity to "show off" in front of family and friends. The horse show will be complete with trophies and certificates for all participants.

Both Karen Stricker and Cathy Homer have seen the benefits that the riders have received from this therapeutic riding program. Besides physical benefits, there are psychological and social ones as well. Motivation is increased, there is some social interaction with other riders, volunteers, and instructors, and some riders form special attachments with the hors-






