OKLAHOMA CITY, OK

SEPTEMBER 20, 1995

Compared to last week: Feeder cattle and calves steady to 1.00 lower. Demand moderate for all classes. Quality of the supply average to mostly plain. Weigh-ups average to many full. Flesh similar to last week with feeders in medium to thin flesh; calves in mostly medium condition but numbers of fleshy soft calves increasing. Brahma cross feeders are receiving their usual seasonal discounts as the first day of fall is near. The cold front that moved toward the combelt Monday caused sharp advances in Monday's grain markets. The expectations of higher feed costs offset last week's friendly cattle on feed report. Slaughter cows 2.00 lower. Slaughter bulls 1.00 lower. Demand moderate. Trade fair-ly active with nearly all packer buyers par-

icipating. Total of 394 cows and bulls sold with about 30 percent replacements.

Receipts this week 8,750; last week 11,895; last year 8,499. Supply consisted of 63 percent yearlings and calves over 600 lb; 33 percent calves under 600 lb; 4 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis. 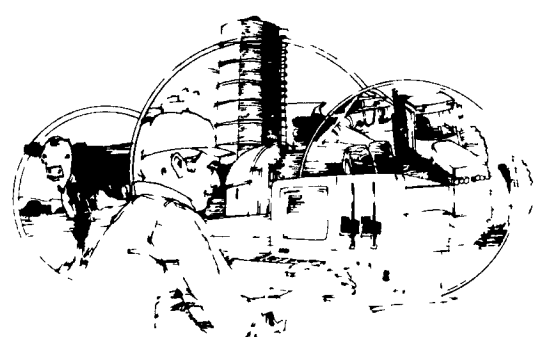

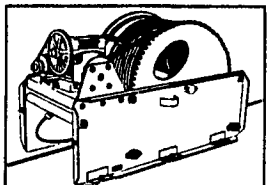

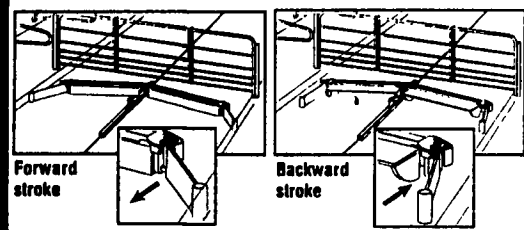
