

All-American Dairy Show Is For Every Dairy Farmer

the Large Arena and the central stall area for the dairy cattle.

A stage is to have been setup and is to provide a forum for the presentations. Also, photographs are to be taken of winners in the youth judging and other contests.

Further, a food court is to be in that building and all the commer-

cial exhibits, and a week-long craft show featuring 11 craft vendors with items such as T-shirts, jewelry, dolls and Christmas items.

The educational series is to start at 1 p.m. Sunday. Dr. Jud Heinrichs, of Penn State University, is to discuss the ramifications of coccidiosis in dairy replacements, followed by some advice from a rep-

resentative from the Upjohn Co. about avoiding antibiotic residues in milk (a particularly controversial issue).

Educational issues range from using professional photography to capture and present top quality cattle for business and posterity, to planning for waste management, cattle disease control, and planning expansions or updating facilities.

Commercial exhibitors can be expected to offer just about anything needed for a dairy farm — from equipment to services such as those available through the Pennsylvania Dairy Herd Improvement Association.

Monday is the big show for all the state's youth with dairy cattle that have survived local and regional judging contests. According to Leshar, a total of from 900 to 1,000 entries are expected for those youth dairy cattle breed shows.

Also on Monday is the Invitational Youth Dairy Cattle Judging Contest which includes 4-H, FFA and collegiate teams from a wide area.

With the All-American shows, Leshar said she expects a turnout of about 2,000 animals including sale cattle.

Monday night is the time for the Pennsylvania Elite Ayrshire Sale, followed the next morning by the All-American Ayrshire Show.

Tuesday's showing highlights also include the Pennsylvania Fall Holstein Championship Show and the All-American Milking Shorthorn Show.

On Wednesday is the National Guernsey Show, the Eastern National Brown Swiss Show, and two important sales — the Top of the Harvest Jersey Sale, and the Eastern National Holstein Sale.

Thursday morning starts with the Eastern National Holstein Show, the Mid-Atlantic Regional

Jersey Show, and then the selection of the supreme champion.

Though the state princess pageant is tonight, expect to see some dairy princesses from other places during the week.

State dairy princesses will certainly be around all week, but this year, expect to see the New York state dairy princess, the Maryland dairy princess and people from 17 states as well as Canada.

"We have been making an attempt to broaden the circle of people in the show to have more people feel they have ownership in the All-American show," Leshar said.

Also, while it may not seem to be a highlight, this year visitors and participants to the All-American are to get the opportunity to be the first, to knowledge, public group to use the newly finished floor in the Main Exhibit Area. New marble logos are to

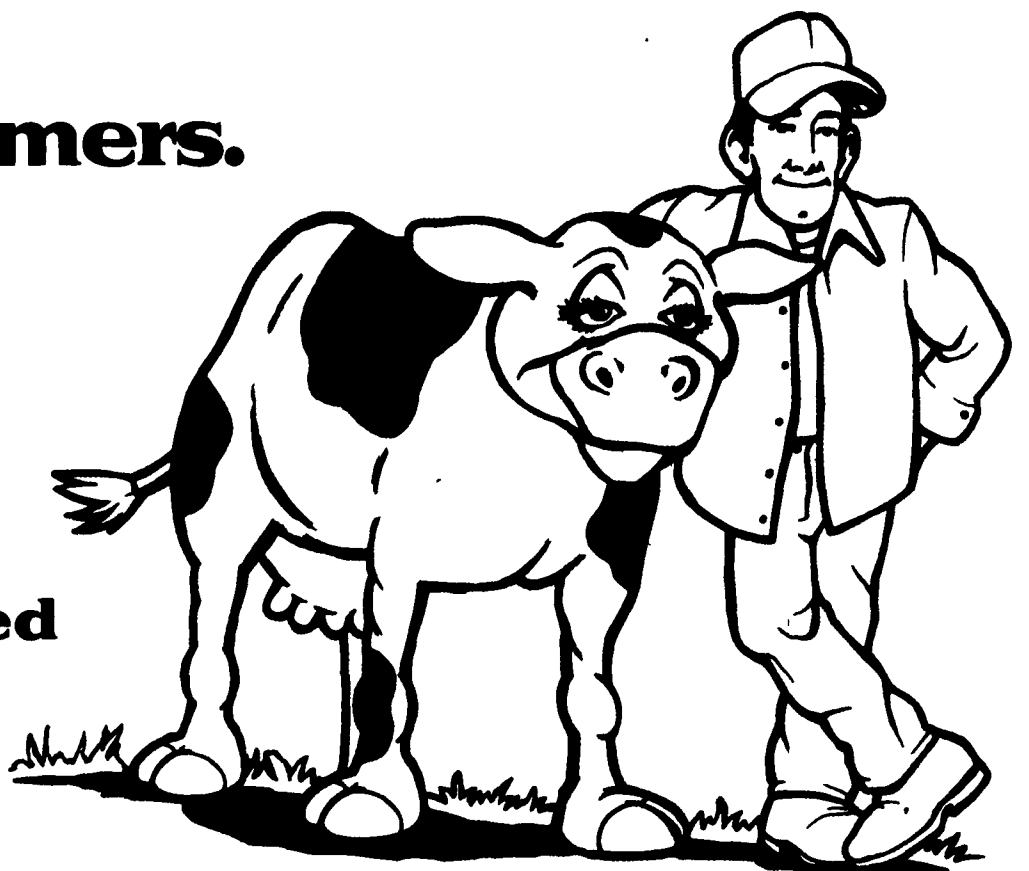

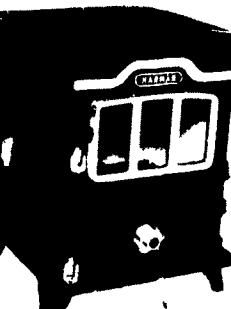
