Barr said that the Fair Tax Institute has developed several new concepts of tax reform that are fair to all people. These will be examined at an upcoming seminar at the Penn Harris Radisson and at the Farm Bureau state convention in November.

The Institute has entered all data concerning budgets and costs to run the government, schools, Dept. of Ag, and other public institutions. This will allow them to design and redesign any plan to come to a consensus of what will

or will not work.
"It may be possible to eliminate real estate taxes in your county. We don't want to get your hopes high, but it is possible," Barr same of the options being considered.

"There's a strong conviction that tax reform is needed. It isn't any question that people want reform. The question is what kind of reform will be fair to all people," Barr said about the complexity of devising a new plan.

As guest speaker, Pennsylvania Farm Burea President Keith Eckel reported on the Farm Bill, "We

like what we see," he said.
