

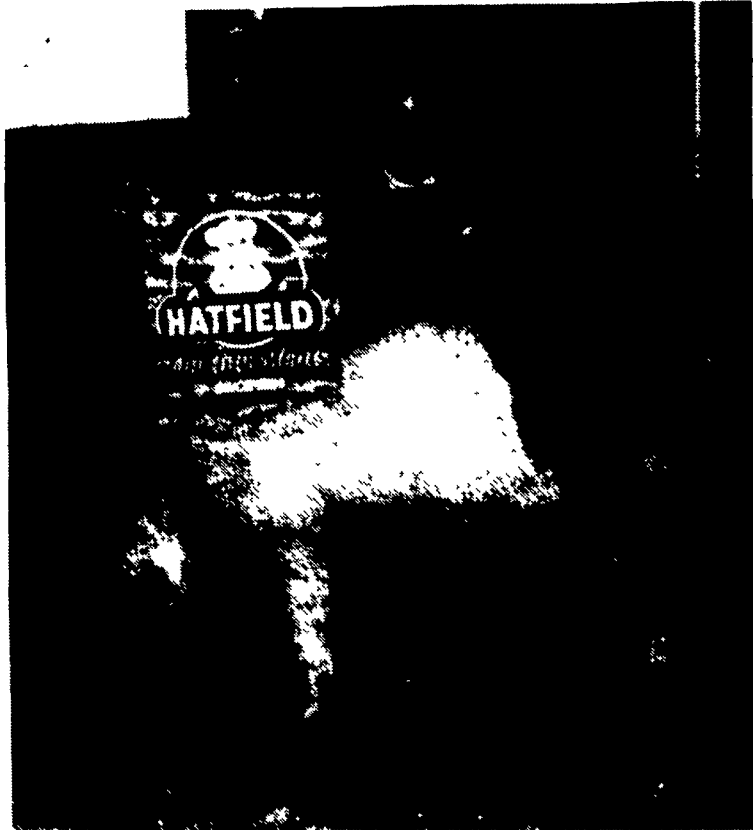
Ephrata Fair Sale Posts Results

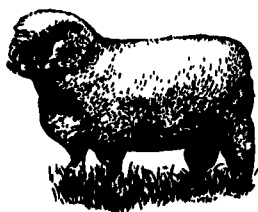

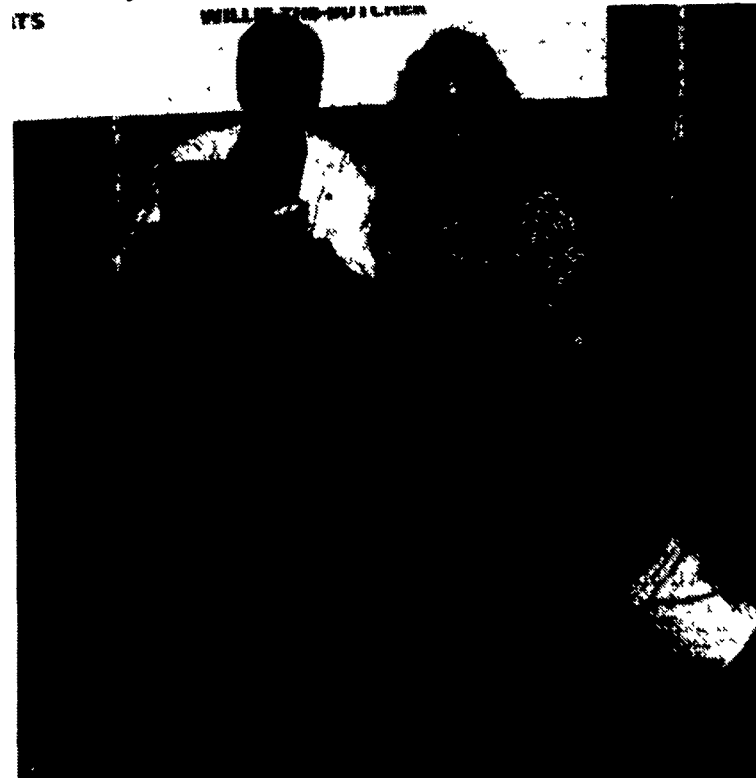
