QUESTION --- Yvonne Lawrence, Newburgh, N.Y., would like to know where to purchase a rhubarb and soda mixture used for indigestion. She used to purchase it in a pharmacy but finds the New York pharmacies don't stock it anymore.

QUESTION — Mrs. William Pierce, Palmyra, would like to know where to purchase antique two-bottom dishes for crocktype chicken water fountains. Must be white with 10-inch top and 8-inch bottom.

ANSWER --- L. Hoover wanted to know why her gladiolus bulbs were moldy. S. Newswanger writes that the bulbs probably have mildew, which can be cured by soaking the bulbs in Lysol water before replanting. Take 3 tablespoons Lysol concentrate to one gallon water. Dry completely before storing. Mrs. Snyder from Fleetwood wrote that it sounds as if the gladiolus are infected with tiny insects called thrips. To solve the problem, submerge infested bulbs in hot water (112-150-degrees) for 20 minutes. Or, dip the bulbs in a solution of 1 to 11/2 tablespoons Lysol disinfectant per gallon of water. Treat bulbs again before planting, then bury in the ground while they are still wet.

ANSWER - A Schuylkill Haven reader sent a folk remedy for arthritis that someone had requested. She writes that it worked for her and knows other people that tried it and found it effective. Once a day drink a mixture with 1 tablet Certo dissolved in 4-ounces of Welch's grape juice. She said it must be Welch's brand.

ANSWER - Anna L. Newswanger, Narvon, wanted to know how to keep dried appleheads (for dolls) from getting bugs. Thanks to Rita Eisensmith, York Haven, who writes that to prevent insects from getting into the apple head, inject an insect repellent into the core.

ANSWER - Kathryn Kern, Fairhope, wanted to know where she can purchase Lasetta material for making afghans. A long needle is used to weave yarn in the material's holes.
