**'Junior' Wins Senior Competition At Manheim Steer Show**

MANHEIM (Lancaster Co.) —

Last year, Casey High's steer, "Big  
Guy," got as far as reserve overall  
champion at the Manheim Farm  
Show. This year, with an ironic  
twist, Casey's steer "Junior" went  
all the way, picking up supreme for  
the second time in three years for  
the Lititz exhibitor.

Casey, 17, son of Mae and Larry  
High, Lititz, exhibited his  
1,277-pound Angus/Maine Anjou  
crossbred, the heavyweight winner  
in the 4-H show, to supreme mark-  
et champion at the Manheim Farm  
Show Tuesday night.

Show judge Ned Sayre, a regis-  
tered Angus cattleman from  
Waffle Hill Farm in Churchville,  
Md., said the champion steer "puts

together the size, weight, and  
degree of conditioning necessary  
in a steer today."

Casey obtained the champion  
steer from Jeff Miller, Indiana.  
Casey, a Warwick High School  
junior, said it was a combination of  
feeding and training that garnered  
him a championship.

Melissa showed "Stew," an  
Angus/Maine Anjou/Simmental  
crossbred to reserve overall market  
steer champion. Melissa, 17,  
daughter of Marlin and Nancy  
Becker, Manheim, showed the  
1,205-pound light heavyweight to  
reserve champion. The West Vir-  
ginia steer was obtained at the  
Keystone International Livestock  
Exposition.

Melissa named the steer "Stew"

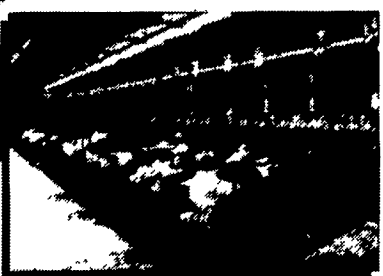
