MANHEIM (Lancaster Co.) — Last year, Casey High's steer, "Big Guy," got as far as reserve overall champion at the Manheim Farm Show. This year, with an ironic twist, Casey's steer "Junior" went all the way, picking up supreme for the second time in three years for the Lititz exhibitor.

Casey, 17, son of Mae and Larry High, Lititz, exhibited his 1,277-pound Angus/Maine Anjou crossbred, the heavyweight winner in the 4-H show, to supreme market champion at the Manheim Farm? Show Tuesday night.




