## Pests Using Fumigants

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.) — The cheapest and safest method of controlling grain pests is prevention.

Fumigation should be considered only as an emergency treatment. Once grain is infested with insects, the quickest and most effective way to remedy the problem is usually with a fumigant.

All fumigants, however, are

hazardous and must be handled with extreme caution. They all have a signal word "Danger" and skull and crossbones on the label and are restricted-use pesticides. As of December 1, 1985, only methyl bromide, chloropicrin, aluminum phosphide, and magnesium phosphide are available for use as grain fumigants. Fumigants or mixtures of fumigants contain-

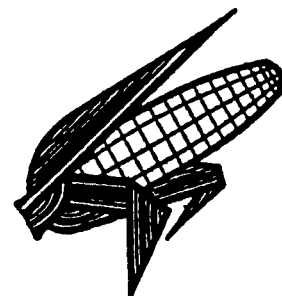
ing ethylene dibromide, carbon tetrachloride, or carbon disulfide are no longer legal for grain fumigation.

The methods of application, dosages, temperature, moisture, exposure periods, and all precautions are listed on the label. Be certain to read and understand all directions before using any fumigant.

Remember:

- Fumigants are generally not fully effective at temperatures below 60 F.
- Aluminum phosphide is

less likely to impair seed viability than are other fumigants.  
• Never use methyl bromide on any grain intended for seed use.
