Live supplies were moderate; weights varied from light to heavy, but were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 67 cents. Trade sentiment was steady, instances fully steady. In the parts complex, bone-in breasts ranged well cleared to adequate. Leg quarters and thighs cleared well at most plants. Boneless skinless breasts were fully adequate. Wings were adequate in moving into closer balance.

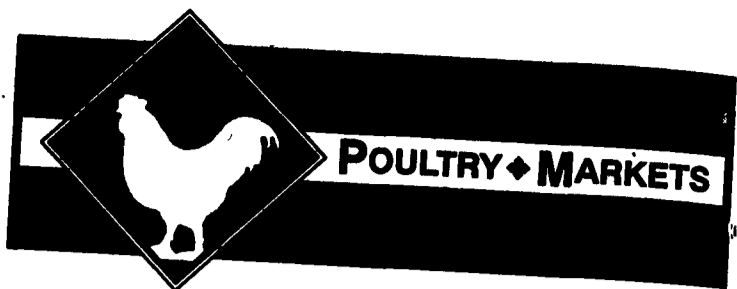

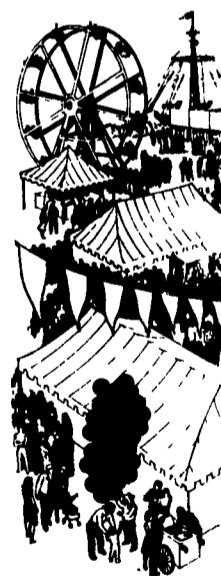
