

Canadian Aged Holstein Is Supreme At World Dairy Expo

MADISON, Wis.—An aged Holstein cow named Rainyridge Tony Beauty was selected as America's supreme champion cow during closing ceremonies at the 29th annual World Dairy Expo in Madison, Wisconsin.

The champ, classified as 3EX 92, was exhibited by Ray Brown of Vista, Manitoba, Canada. At 6 years of age, Rainyridge Tony Beauty had a 305-day production record of 21,390 pounds of milk, 791 pounds of fat and 705 pounds of protein. She is sired by Marshfield Elevation Tony and her dam is Despics Tempo Diane.

The reserve supreme champion honors went to a Guernsey cow named Westlynn Tom Dee. She is owned by Rueth and Kortus and Vilter of Hartland, Wis. Westlynn Tom Dee was grand champion female of the Central Grand National Guernsey Show during last year's World Dairy Expo. Sired by Westlynn Emory Tom, the champion cow produced a 305-day production record of 22,840 pounds of milk, 1,101 pounds of fat and 822 pounds of protein. Her dam is Westlynn Pepper Delight.

A Jersey cow named Duncan

Eilene of HLF was named the supreme champion cow of the junior show during World Dairy Expo. She was exhibited by Shannon N. Anderson of HLF Jerseys in New Philadelphia, Ohio. During the Central National Jersey Show held at the 29th annual World Dairy Expo, the champ also garnered the reserve grand champion female honors. Five-year-old Duncan Eilene of HLF produced a 108-day record of 7,410 pounds of milk, 359 pounds of fat and 269 pounds of protein.

The reserve supreme champion of the junior show was a Holstein

cow named Gentry-Acres Gambler Sue. She is owned by Natalie Borba of Escalon, California. At 4 years of age the champ had a 305-day production record of 25,400 pounds of milk, 1,253 pounds of fat and 814 pounds of protein.

A record number of dairy cattle competed this year at the 29th annual World Dairy Expo, Oct. 4-8 in Madison, Wisconsin. A record 1,911 animals from seven breed shows competed in the show ring.

Holstein Show

In addition to Rainyridge Tony

Beauty garnering top honors in the International Holstein Show, the reserve grand champion was C ALanvale Inspiration Tina owned by Kueffner Holsteins of Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

Premier breeder honors went to Oscar Dupasquier of Guelph, Ontario, Canada and Kueffner Holsteins of Winston-Salem, North Carolina was named premier exhibitor.

In the junior show, Gentry-Acres Gambler Sue was named grand champion female. She is sired by Strickler MGM Gambler and her dam is Penn-Grove Toddsdale Dimples.

The reserve grand champion female of the junior show went to Hardindale Mark Rosita, owned by Scott Long, Clayton, Michigan.

During the International Holstein Show, 464 Holsteins competed.

Guernsey Show

In addition to Westlynn Tom Dee making a repeat victory as grand champion of the Central National Guernsey Show, a cow named Jastes Ben Joy garnered the reserve grand champion female honors. She is owned by the Ben Joy Syndicate of Salvia, Kentucky.

Randy and Wanda Knapp of Epworth, Iowa, were named both premier breeder and premier exhibitor for the Central National Guernsey Show.

In the junior show, Ocooch Fayette Meka received grand champion female honors. The champ is a senior 3-year-old and was exhibited by Elizabeth Herges of Livingston, Wisconsin. At 2 years, 4 months of age, Ocooch Fayette Meka had a 365-day production record of 15,241 pounds of milk, 783 pounds of fat and 562 pounds of protein.

The reserve grand champion female of the junior show was Sandy Hill Wandas Winnie. She was exhibited by Jessica Eilers of Scotch Grove, Iowa.

During the Central National Guernsey Show, 155 animals competed in the show ring.

Ayrshire Show

A senior 3-year-old Ayrshire dairy cow exhibited by David Koss of Ski Pal Ayrshires in Epworth, Iowa, was selected as this year's grand champion female of the Central National Ayrshire Show.

The animal, named Family-AF-AYR A.J. Julia, was sired by Forever Schoon, A.J. Her dam is Jan's Hi Jennifer. The champion produced a 305-day production record of 17,940 pounds of milk, 746 pounds of fat and 637 pounds of protein.

A cow named Blackaddar Emily 2 won reserve grand champion female honors and was exhibited by Mount and Allan Barr of Woodland View Farm, Knowlton, Quebec, Canada.

In the junior show, Blue Meadows Suzie ET, exhibited by Rebecca Seifert of Acampo, California, was named the grand champion. The reserve grand champion of the junior show was Vales-Pride Olympic Rosie. She is bred and owned by Mark Valentine of Thurmont, Maryland.

Moy-Ayr Farm of Whitewater, Wisconsin, was named premier breeder. Ski Pal Ayrshires and Moy-Ayr Farm shared the honor for premier exhibitor.

A total of 168 animals competed in the show ring.

Brown Swiss

A 6-year-old Brown Swiss owned by Kruses Swiss Farm of Earlville, Iowa, was selected as this year's grand champion of the Central National Brown Swiss Show. The animal—named Kruses GK Jade Fantasy Vix ET—was exhibited by the Larry Kruse family, owners of Kruses Swiss Farm.

Sired by Bridgeview Elegant Jade, the champion produced a 305-day record of 18,190 pounds of milk, 978 pounds of fat, and 711 pounds of protein. Her dam is Kruses Beautician Vixie.

A cow named Hawthorne Rhythmic Riki TW won reserve grand champion honors and is owned by Jose Evanda, Neiva, Brazil.

The Pete Vanderham family, owners of Bridge View Swiss in Mira Loma, Calif., was named both premier breeder and premier exhibitor. Bridgeview Elegant Jade was named premier sire.

In the junior show, R&S Jubilation Rosy received grand champion honors. The champion 3-year-old was exhibited by Jason Luttrupp of Berlin, Wis.

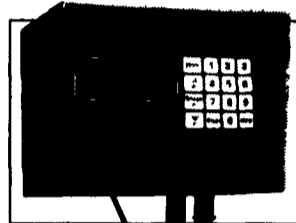
