Announces Call For Contestants

ST. LOUIS, Mo. — The American Soybean Association (ASA) announces a call for contestants for the Soybean Marketing Challenge, which begins December 1 and runs until November 1, 1996.

During that time, producers get hands-on experience for both before and after harvest. The Challenge is sponsored by the American Soybean Association and American Cyanamid.

This popular program affords producers an opportunity to practice marketing soybeans for more profit, without actually risking a dime. Producers in 17 states participated in last year's contest.

The Challenge provides an opportunity to test marketing skills on the Chicago Board of Trade using a fictitious soybean crop. Whoever makes the most money on those soybeans will win. But even though there are great prizes for winning marketers, the Soybean Marketing Challenge is more than a game or contest. It is a unique educational opportunity based on real time trading.

Here's how it works: producers will be marketing the soybeans raised on the "Challenge Farm," 500 acres of soybean production based on the 1995 national average soybean yield. Participants will "open an account" with the Challenge trading desk and market new-crop 1995 soybeans. The contest will work just like the market and "authentic" account

statements will be issued.

A special 800 number is provided to make "transactions." Accounts are treated like real ones, with margin calls, commission fees and storage costs to be drawn

from an imaginary beginning cash balance of \$20,000. The account statements will reflect these deductions and all transactions. In addition, participants will receive a trading manual and monthly

newsletters from a University economist.

Open to all soybean farmers. the registration fee for a full-play. ing member is just \$59. If you wish to receive the marketing ma. terials and observe the game without actually playing, the fee is \$39. A special student rate is also offered for just \$25.

The grand prize winner of the Challenge will be awarded 400 acres of Pursuit herbicide and a trip for two to the Chicago Board of Trade! (Grand prize value approximately \$7,500. First, second and third prizes also awarded.) On top of the grand prize, last year's contest winner added 87 cents per bushel based on the techniques he learned using the Challenge contest materials. How much additional value would that 87 cents have added to the average crop last year?
