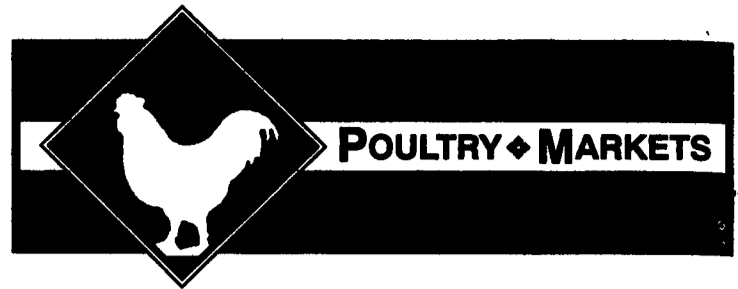

Prices were higher. The market tone was fully steady to firm. Demand for trucklot volumes was light as most large buyers were already covered, but less-than-trucklot buying was fairly active as buyers hesitated to purchase full trucklots, and instead only purchased for immediate needs. Floor stocks were adequate. Raw material prices were unchanged to higher, and supplies were mixed with some plants seeking eggs while others offered gradable nest run eggs into shell egg channels.
