NAILE Opens Nov. 4

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — The world's largest, all-breed, purebred livestock show — the North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) — officially opens Nov. 4 at the Kentucky Fair & Exposition Center. It will continue through noon, Friday, Nov. 17.

Premiums will exceed \$500,000 and more than 19,500 entries will be featured this year. More than 120 separate events are on the 1995 schedule. Shows are held for the following livestock species: dairy cattle, dairy goats, llamas and alpacas, swine, quarter horses, draft horses, beef cattle

and sheep. Many breeds schedule sales during the expo. The sales have become important events for those who may not be showing at the expo, but who are seeking quality animals for their breeding programs.

The expo's overall schedule by division is:

- Nov. 5-6: Junior Swine Show—South Wing
- Nov. 10-11: Draft Horse Show—Freedom Hall
- Nov. 11-17: Sheep Shows & Sales—South Wing

•Nov. 12: Junior Wether Show—South Wing; Junior Steer Show—Freedom Hall; Pen-of-Three & Single Steer Show—Broadbent Arena; Feeder Calf Sale—Newmarket Hall.

•Nov. 11-17: Beef Cattle Shows & Sales—Freedom Hall.

The NAILE is also home to many youth and collegiate livestock judging events, including the National Collegiate Livestock Judging and National Junior College Livestock Judging Contests. The Science Diet Stockdog Trials are run Nov. 9-12 and boast premiums in excess of \$12,000.

The sale of champions and free country concert signal expo's grand finale on the evening of Nov. 16. The expo is open to the public and admission is \$3 for adults and \$1 for children. Season passes are \$10.

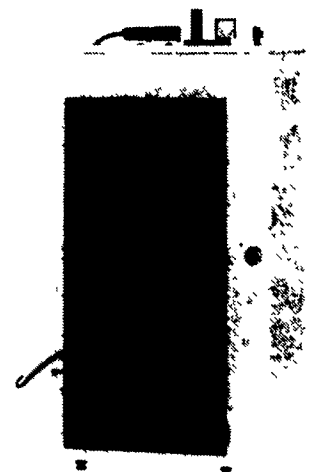
