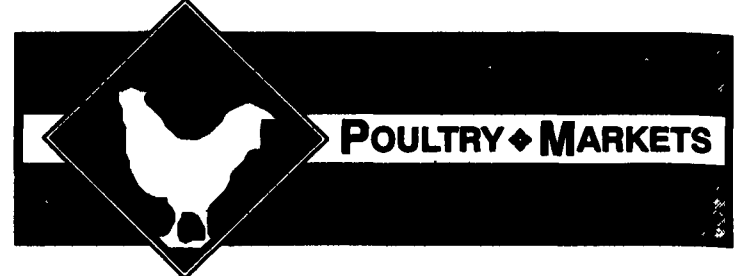

Movement of ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers was moderate to good. Offerings were adequate to closely balanced and were clearing satisfactorily at most plants. Live supplies ranged light to heavy; weights were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 56 to 67 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. In the parts complex, whole breasts were no more than adequate. Legs were tight. Boneless skinless breasts and leg quarters were adequate. Wings were less readily available, but were still ample and generally slow to clear.

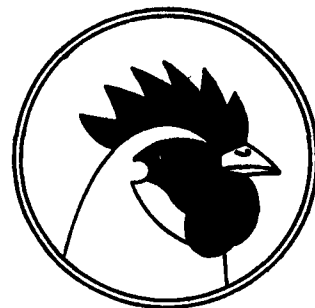
