The Catoctin FFA Chapter won the first place banner in the livestock judging contest.

The Livestock contest is sponsored by R.D. Bowman & Sons, Inc. as a special project of the Maryland FFA Foundation. The high scoring individual for Livestock was Missy Willard, FFA member of the Catoctin Chapter. The Flintstone Chapter took the second place banner in the contest.

According to the Contest Superintendent Martin Hamilton, 4-H agent for the Cooperative Extension Service of the University of Maryland, there were 10 teams with 34 members participating. Contestants were asked to place six classes of livestock of four animals each and to prepare and present one set of oral reasons. Lee Heavner of the Flintstone FFA Chapter was the teacher chairperson and supervised scoring.

The winning teams in the livestock judging contest from first through fifth were Catoctin, Flintstone, South Carroll, South Garrett, and Queen Anns.

The poultry contest is sponsored by the Delmarva Poultry Industry, Inc. as a special project of the Maryland FFA Foundation.

The high scoring individual for the contest was Matt Michael of the Clear Spring FFA Chapter. The Clear Spring FFA Chapter took the second place banner in the contest.

According to Contest Superintendent Dr. Charles Waybeck of the Poultry Science Department at

the University of Maryland, the contest included evaluation and placing of live birds, ready to cook poultry classes, and processed chicken porducts. Contestants were also required to identify broiler parts and grade eggs for interior and exterior quality. In addition, oral reasons or written factors were required on some classes and a written multiple choice test was completed by contestants.

#### FFA Safe Tractor Operator Contest

The event was sponsored by Eastern Equipment Dealers Association as a special project of the Maryland FFA Foundation. The second place individual for the Safe Tractor Operators Contest was Jason Barkdoll of the Boonsboro FFA Chapter.

According to Contest Superintendent Dr. Lee Grant of the Department of Agricultral Engineering at the University of Maryland at College Park, the contest consisted of three components --- a written examination, safe tractor operation, and a problem solving activity.

Each student drove a tractor through two courses, one with a two-wheel implement and one with four-wheel implement towed behind. The students were evaluated during the driving section on safety, time, and their accuracy while driving the course. In the problem solving, each student was given a tractor that would not start and had to find the problem and correct it.

#### **FFA Suits MHS** Students To A "Tee"

The advantages of FFA membership are "par for the course" for several Milton Hershey School (MHS) FFA members who recently opened a miniature golf course for MHS students and staff members in a barn at student home Vian.

Conducted as an FFA business project, the enterprise began last spring when students designed the mini-golf course, built it to scale, then used their design to completely renovate a donated miniature golf course. MHS Senior Hall Teacher Don Hoffer directed the students' repair and refurbishing work as a construction class project.

Following the completion of the course, students worked with adult staff members over the summci to install the course in a gutted school barn. Tasks included removing, reglazing, and reinstalling windows and pouring concrete.

Designing the course around the roadway theme, the students also created score cards through the school's communications technology course with names such as "Falling Rocks," "Cattle Crossing," and "Dead End"

assigned to the 18 holes.

Currently, students are managing the course, collecting fees, and maintaining books. According to MHS student Rey Del Rio, golf course manager, at least 40 MHS students and staff members play the greens on an average weekend.

Describing what he learned from the project, MHS student Bob Stroup, golf course treasurer, said, "The responsibilities that this golf course has given us will help us in the future. It's helping us to learn how to take care of property, run a business, and work with other people."

Another student said, "When I look at the course, it gives me a feeling of accomplishment."
