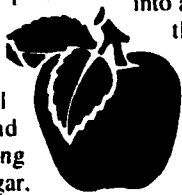
To wash wooden floors, mix 1/4 cup glass cleaner per gallon of water.

INDIAN SUMMER APPLESAUCE

4 quarts (1/2 peck) apples,
2 cups sugar
3 or 4 purple plums, pitted
juice from 1/2 to 1 lemon to
taste
cinnamon
nutmeg

or adjust to taste. Simmer another couple of minutes, until sugar is dissolved. Pour by small amounts into a food mill or other sieve, and press out the applesauce, discarding peels, seeds, and cores. Stir lemon juice cinnamon, and nutmeg into applesauce. Can in the usual manner, freeze in freezer bags, or refrigerate until used. Makes about 2 quarts.

Wash and quarter apples and plums to fill a 4-quart pot. (No need to peel or core apples.) Add 2 cups water, cover and boil until apples are soft and the peels are falling off. Add 2 cups sugar,

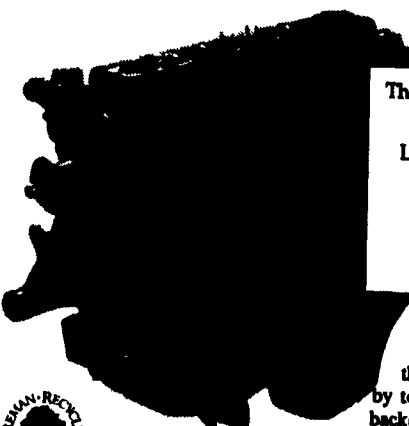

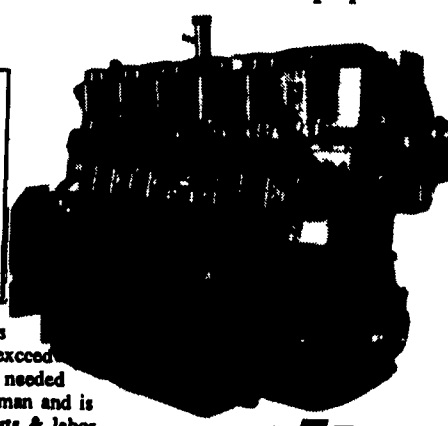

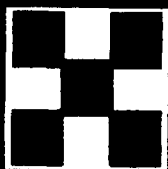
