## Pa. Farm Bureau To Meet

CAMP HILL (Cumberland Co.)---The 45th annual meeting of the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau (PFB) will take place Nov. 13-15 at the Hershey Lodge and Convention Center in Hershey.

The main business of the meeting will be the election of leaders and the setting policies on statewide issues affecting agriculture. The presentation of awards, information conferences and other activities will also highlight the three-day session.

Several hundred farm leaders, including 169 voting delegates, will gather to set the future course of the organization. Voting delegates will deliberate on about 150 proposed policy resolutions for the organization which were developed from grassroots input by members in county farm bureaus.


Policy resolutions will focus on issues such as tax reform, highway funding and milk safety requirements. Voting delegates will also be electing the organization's vice president and eight of the 16 district representatives on PFB's state board of directors.

Governor Tom Ridge will be the keynote speaker at the annual meeting's opening luncheon. Monday, Nov. 13. Ridge appeared at PFB's 1993 annual meeting as a participant in a "Meet The Candidates" debate for the office of Governor. PFB president Keith Eckel of Clarks Summit, Lackawanna County will present the President's Address to the organization at Tuesday's luncheon, Nov. 14.

Several annual awards will be presented during the convention. The "Distinguished Service To Agriculture Award" will be presented to a person or persons who have made a significant contribution to the betterment of Pennsylvania agriculture. The top county in farm bureau program achievements will receive the "All Star Award." In addition, the "Outstanding Young Farmer Award" will be presented to one of three finalists in the competition which recognizes outstanding business accomplishments and leadership exhibited before age 30.

Other activities during the annual meeting include a discussion meet contest sponsored by PFB's young farmers and ranchers committee.


