Movement of ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers continued good in most quarters and offerings were generally no more than adequate. Live supplies varied, but were about moderate overall; weights were mixed in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent higher at 59 to 70 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady to mostly firm. Boneless skinless breasts were ample for current needs. Bone-in breasts, leg items and wings cleared well at most plants. Tenders were available and slow to clear.


