Movement of ready-to-cook whole broiler/fryers continued good in most quarters and offerings were generally no more than adequate. Live supplies varied, but were about moderate overall; weights were mixed in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent higher at 59 to 70 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady to mostly firm. Boneless skinless breasts were ample for current needs. Bone-in breasts, leg items and wings cleared well at most plants. Tenders were available and slow to clear.

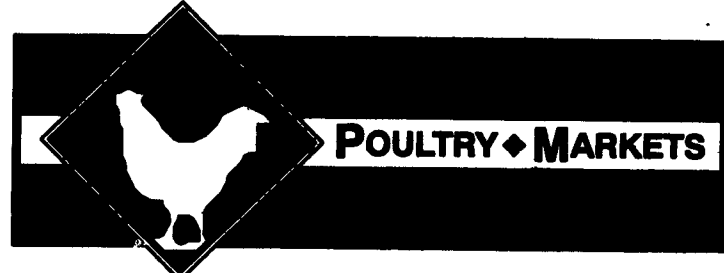

MARKET COMMENT: PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO HIGHER IN THE PHILADELPHIA AREA, PRICES PAID TO PRODUCERS IN NEW ENGLAND WERE HIGHER FOR EXTRA-LARGE THROUGH SMALLS, AND THE BALANCE OF CATEGORIES WERE UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS FULLY STEADY TO FIRM, STRONGEST FOR WHITE EGGS. DEMAND WAS MIXED, MOSTLY MODERATE INTO RETAIL AVENUES, AND MODERATE TO GOOD INTO FOOD SERVICE. BREAKING STOCK WAS ABOUT ADEQUATE UNDER A FULLY STEADY TO FIRM TRADE SENTIMENT, AND PRICES WERE HIGHER.
