NOVEMBER 9, 1995

Prices were higher. The market tone was fully steady to firm. Demand remained generally moderate with most inquiry centered on immediate needs. Floor stocks were usually adequate, but replacement costs increased as shell and liquid egg prices increased. Breaking stock supplies were tight to adequate and held with confidence for higher prices. Liquid and frozen eggs processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending November 4, 1995 were 4% greater than last week, and 6% less than the same week last year.

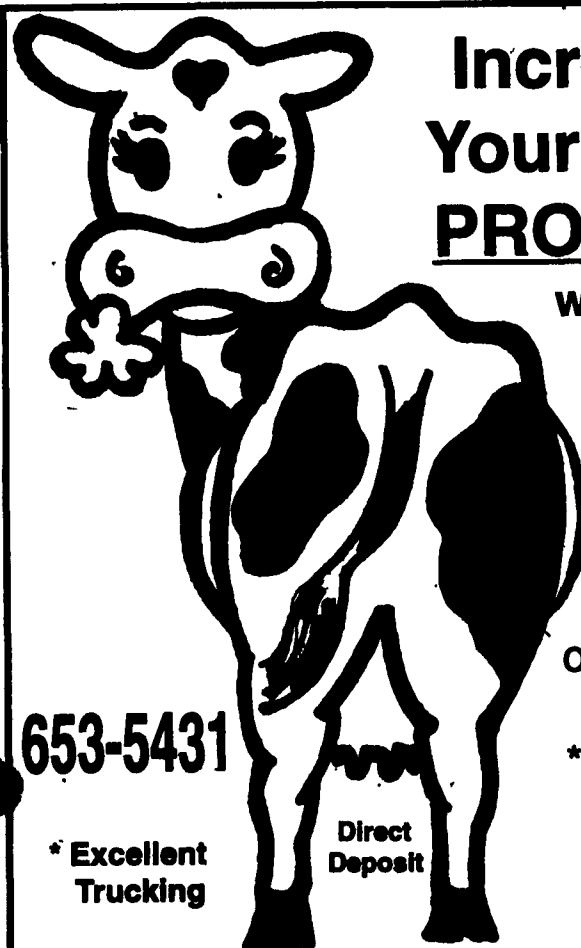
