Breaking stock supplies were generally adequate, and prices were unchanged.

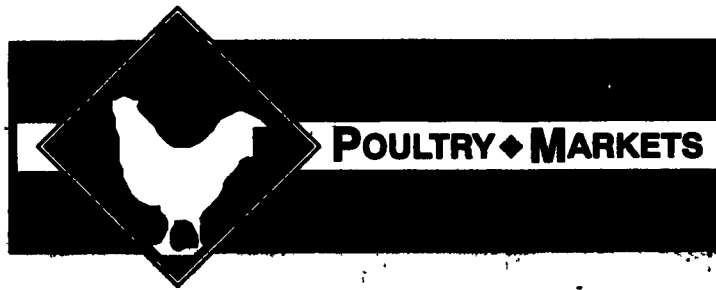

DEMAND WAS FAIR TO GOOD, BEST INTO INTERDEALER CHANNELS WHEN INCREASED HOLIDAY NEEDS DEPLETED CARTONED AND GRADED LOOSE FLOOR STOCKS. SUPPLIES OF LARGE WHITE EGGS WERE SHORT TO ADEQUATE, BROWN EGGS WERE ALSO SHORT IN SOME AREAS, AND THE BALANCE OF CATEGORIES WERE GENERALLY ADEQUATE.
