

### OK City Feeder Cattle

OKLAHOMA CITY, OK  
NOVEMBER 15, 1995

Compared to last week: Feeder steers and heifers steady. Steer calves steady; heifer calves 1.00-3.00 higher. Demand very good for calves and yearlings. Quality average to attractive with calf quality the best this season. Yearlings in thin to medium flesh with average to full weigh-ups. Calf flesh medium to heavy with average weigh-ups. Slaughter cows steady to 1.00 higher, advance on Cutters; exception noted on Canners 1.00-2.00 lower. Slaughter bulls weak. Packer demand just moderate as cow supplies ample and no stretching needed. Older bred cows continue to go to slaughter as not enough wheat pasture available to entice farmers into the other route. Bulk of cows continue to be old and in need of culling. 886 cows and bulls sold with 80 percent to packers. Receipts this week 14,875; last week 10,723; last year 14,416. Supply consisted of 44 percent yearlings and numerous calves over 600 lbs; 50 percent calves under 600 lbs; 6 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis. 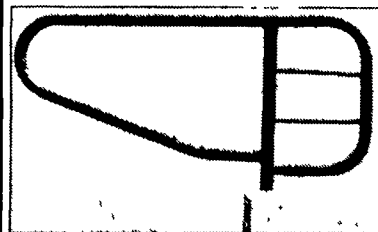

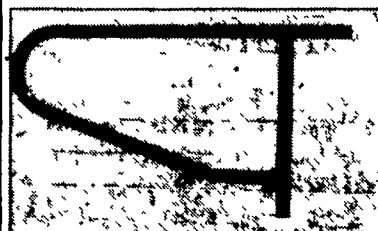

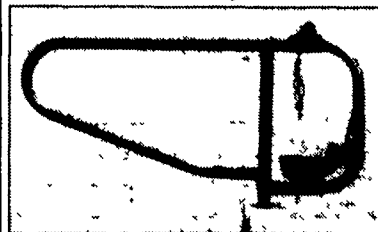
