MARKET COMMENT: PRICES WERE UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS STEADY TO FULLY STEADY. DEMAND WAS FAIR TO GOOD, AND LAST MINUTE HOLIDAY DISTRIBUTION CONTINUED. SUPPLIES OF CARTONED AND GRADED EGGS WERE TIGHT TO ADEQUATE, AND UNGRADED EGGS WERE ADEQUATE AND AVAILABLE. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE UNDER A STEADY TRADE SENTIMENT. PHILADELPHIA: PRICES TO RETAILERS, SALES TO VOLUME BUYERS, USDA GRADE A AND GRADE A WHITE EGGS IN CARTONS, DELIVERED STORE DOOR, CENTS PER DOZEN. 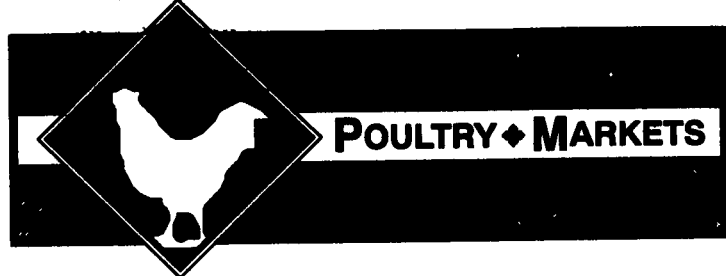
