 Grain and soybean bids were all lower in slow trading ahead of the holiday this week. No new exports were reported overnight for any commodity and profit taking set in on the board. Wheat 1 to 7 cents lower. Corn 1 to 4 cents lower. Sorghum 5 to 8 cents lower. Soybeans 1 to 6 cents lower. Wheat bids lost yesterday's gains in pre-holiday trading. Export demand continued nil and nothing on the books at this time. Some dry weather in winter wheat growing areas, limited declines. Corn and soybean bids extended Monday's losses as export sales re-main quiet, fund selling on the board continued and a pick up in farmer selling ahead of the Thanksgiving holiday. This could be the story the rest of the week.

 Oklahoma National Stockyards Weekly Cattle Summary
 Compared to last Monday: Feeder cattle and calves steady to 1.00 higher. Demand very good for all classes. Quality of supply slipped some from last week and about average. Yearling weigh-ups average to full; calves mostly average. Calf flesh medium to moderately fleshy; yearlings medium to thin. Several drafts of calves coming in off wheat that didn't make pasture due to dry conditions. High cost of feedlot gains and wide spreads in Choice and Select carcasses has created excellent

demand for lo Medium frame feeders. Very Large frame feeders losing popularity for same reasons. Slaughter cows steady to 1.00 higher, advance on Cutters. Slaughter bulls steady. Packer demand fairly good. Dressing percents improved with a larger number of cows in good flesh and gaunt weigh-ups and considerable decrease in very low dressing cull cows. Total of 475 cows and bulls sold with about 80 percent going to packers. Receipts this week 9,950; last week 14,929; last year 6,280. Supply consisted of 54 percent yearlings and many calves over 600 lbs; 41 percent calves under 600 lbs; 5 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.

These buyers will get a percentage of the tobacco according to the amount they bought over 3-5 year average at auction. Tobacco will be divided out as such.

Remember, there is only 100% of the tobacco offered. What will the buyer do to get more tobacco?

- 1 - raise the price at auction, or
- 2 - buy on the farm

If the buyer buys on the farm he will tell the farmer that there's no commission to warehouse and that his price will be the same as at the auction. But, what will the on-farm buyer pay for low grade? If the buyer docks you on a 800 lb. skid - it could pay the commission for your whole crop selling at auction.

We like all buyers to buy at auction - we need your tobacco. We need a full warehouse first sale Please color grade

- Put bright tobacco in one grade
 - Put tips in one grade
 - Put ground leaves in one grade
- Watch your moisture-strip dry and keep green out!
