
information to growing herdbook associations and breeder groups wanting to organize. D. Share protocols for genetic exchange between member countries (semen, embryos, cattle). E. Provide interpretation for genetic evaluations and herdbook records. F. Work toward unified type evaluations and production proofs. G. Establish publications exchange between countries. H. Share data beneficial to management of and marketing of Brown Swiss genejoint concerns and unified positions of "Americas" for future sessions of "World Federation of Brown Swiss Cattle Breeders."

Seventeen countries are known to have organized Brown Swiss associations in the Americas and Caribbean. Each country has been asked to assist in the organizational effort with an initial \$200 membership fee followed by a \$100 annual membership fee.
