MARKET COMMENT: PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO LOWER IN PHILADELPHIA FOR MEDIUMS, BROWN LARGE AND EXTRA-LARGE IN NEW ENGLAND WERE UNCHANGED TO HIGHER, AND THE BALANCE OF PRICES WERE UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS MIXED, MOSTLY STEADY, BUT WEAK FOR WHITE MEDIUMS, AND FULLY STEADY TO FIRM FOR BROWN LARGE SIZES. DEMAND WAS MOSTLY MODERATE. SUPPLIES OF WHITE LARGE SIZES WERE ADEQUATE OR AVAILABLE, WHITE MEDIUMS WERE ADEQUATE TO AMPLE, BROWN LARGE SIZES WERE TIGHT TO ADEQUATE, AND OTHER SIZES WERE GENERALLY ADEQUATE. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE UNDER A STEADY TRADE SENTIMENT. 
