Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds varied, but was generally no better than moderate. Offerings were fully sufficient to handle the seasonally reduced inquiry. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights ranged light to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53 to 64 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady. In the parts complex, bone-in breasts remained tight. Boneless skinless breasts were in generally good balance. Leg quarters were fully adequate. Wings were available at some plants, short at others.

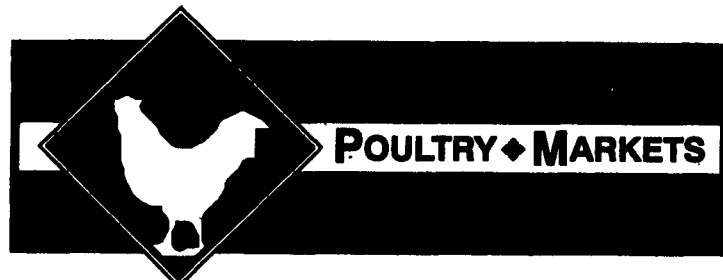

Trucklot buying interest was seasonal and was generally no better than moderate. Bone-in breasts remained tight. Boneless skinless breasts were adequate and clearing well. Leg quarters were fully adequate. Wings were well cleared at some plants, fully adequate at others. Retail and distributive movement was mostly light to fair at best; floor stocks were fully adequate. The market tone was steady to cautiously firm on breast items, steady on the balance.

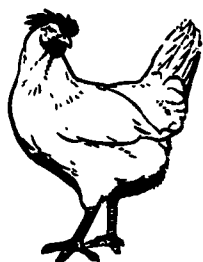

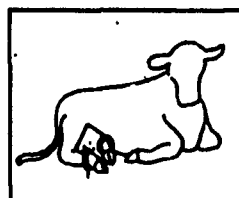
