MARKET COMMENT: PRICES PAID TO PRODUCERS FOR BROWN EXTRA-LARGE, LARGE, AND MEDIUM WERE HIGHER, PRICES TO RETAILERS FOR ALL BROWN SIZES WERE UNCHANGED TO HIGHER, AND THE BALANCE OF PRICES WERE UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS STEADY FOR WHITE EGGS, AND FULLY STEADY TO FIRM FOR BROWN EGGS. DEMAND WAS FAIR TO GOOD, BEST INTO RETAIL SPECIALS. SUPPLIES OF BROWN EGGS WERE TIGHT TO BARELY ADEQUATE, AND WHITE EGGS WERE GENERALLY ADEQUATE OR AVAILABLE AND HELD FOR THE APPROACHING HOLIDAYS. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE FROM REGULAR SUPPLIERS, AND THE TRADE SENTIMENT WAS STEADY. PRICES TO RETAILERS, SALES TO VOLUME BUYERS, USDA GRADE A AND GRADE A, WHITE EGGS IN CARTONS, DELIVERED TO STORE DOOR, CENTS PER DOZEN: EXTRA LARGE .95-.97, LARGE .93-.95, MEDIUM .78-.80.
